

REPORT OF PARAMOTOR´S SECTOR IN SPAIN 2021

1.1 General Activity

During 2021 the activity in the paramotor sector has relatively slow growth due to covid restrictions.

It remains difficult to know the exact number of paramotor pilots currently active in the United States as many of them fly without a registered rating therefore the data is not shared, but approximately 5000 pilots currently rated through the USPPA. There are only 60 pilots with a national license (the national license qualifies you to compete at a national level).

1.2 Accidents

There have been both major accidents and minor incidents with injuries in ankles and knees. We believe that the job regarding safety in the paramotor flying relies on proper training and safety awareness provided through proper education and mentoring programs currently being developed.

1.3 Regulations.

No regulation changes in 2021. We do expect changes in the short term.

As you may know, in the USA, paramotors are regulated by the Federal Aviation Association and they are managed by the Regional Federations.

Some regulations prevent US pilots from attempting world records.


The USPPA is in charge of a self regulated ratings system that provides the avenue through the National Aeronautical Association for FAI licensing.
